³ GERM 103 combines GERM 101 and 102 in a single semester and is recommended a.) for students with prior German background enrolling via placement or b.) for beginning students with a strong background in another language who wish to take an accelerated course.

⁴ German Studies majors must take either 4 hours of upper division German courses or 4 credits of German-themed courses offered by other departments; please see catalog for the listing of approved courses. These are all upper division courses.

⁵ GERM 351 and 361 are courses with varying topics, such as Terrorism in Literature and Film, Crime Narratives in Literature and Film, and German for Business. Students may take more than one topic under the same course number. Some courses also include CATC Thematic Tags.

⁶ Study abroad is a requirement for the German Studies major, either via the Wheaton in Germany program (8), or via an approved semester abroad or summer intensive program with 8 credits of German coursework.

-GERM 372 is open to German Studies majors by special permission and is recommended for students anticipating graduate study in the humanities or theological studies. GERM 372 is a prerequisite for GERM 373.
