The Latin American and Latino Studies major requires 24 hours of courses in Spanish. Study abroad courses taught in Spanish may be counted as LALS major electives. Students who begin their Spanish studies at the 100-level or 200-level can also complete a Latin American and Latina/o Studies major at Wheaton; they would begin taking the 300-level courses following completion of Spanish 201.

Students may choose HNGR, Wheaton in Mexico, or another approved program. Courses taken in the summer Wheaton in Latin America or Wheaton in Spain can count toward the major.
