Building Block Cities in the Czech Republic

Nathan and Vera Beck (FM 2002, I 1998), missionaries in the Czech Republic, wrote to us about a new evangelistic outreach in their area using Lego blocks.

Lego Project Outreach is organized by the Brethren Church to reach out to non-Christian kids. The event is typically run in churches. For three days, kids come together in the afternoon to build a huge Lego city. The goals are to point out God as the creator of the universe, who made us in His image and gave us creativity, and to teach important biblical principles for life. The hope was to invite the kids into the church youth groups where they could explore the Gospel deeper. Lego Project is a lot of work - a lot of kids and thousands of Lego pieces are involved, but everyone loves it! For some kids this was the first time they ever heard about God.

Reaching the Ethiopian Diaspora With Cell Phones

Girma Gebremedhin is a BGC International Christian Leader, graduating in May 2012 with an MA in Evangelism & Leadership. While completing his studies, he has become involved with [Berea Teleconferencing](#), a ministry to Ethiopians and Eritreans all over the world via cell phones and Internet videos.

Berea Teleconferencing is a ministry run by a group of committed Ethiopian Christians living in North America. The ministry has three main focus areas: first encouraging and equipping Christians through Bible Study, worship, teachings, and prayer, second encouraging God's people to be part of God's mission all over the world, and third discipling Christians unable to attend church services for various reasons. Every day, hundreds of people log in to the site from all over the world or call a number from their cell phones allowing them to hear a message for the day and interact with the site coordinators by phone. I was invited by one of our friends to join the ministry, and I have seen the eagerness of many Christians to learn God's word. I also realized I can meet many more non-believers on this site than in a regular Sunday service. I have been able to lead 35 people to Christ in the past four months. I hope to continue in this ministry when I return to Ethiopia; I emailed an update to my leaders there, and they are already in the process of starting a similar ministry!
