### FORMAT

- No more than 20 double-spaced pages
- 12 point standard font
- References and footnotes according to MLA, APA CMS or CBA style
- Include title on the bottom right of each page

### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Current, undergraduate Wheaton College students
- Paper must not have been previously published
- Papers submitted for in-class credit are eligible, must be original work

### **SUBMISSION**

- Include contest entry form student's name should ONLY be on this form. Do NOT put name on the manuscript
